Mission Statement

Because we are a part of the family of God, saved by grace through our Lord Jesus Christ, we are empowered by God, to provide the means for Christian growth, and to equip the members, with the help of the Holy Spirit, to be the heart, hands, and feet of Jesus Christ in our daily lives.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

What are we to do, where are we to turn when there is a need for healing among us? There are those, young and old, in our own community, congregation, and families that are in need of healing in mind, body, or spirit. Who has never experienced the grief of the loss of a loved one, or lived with the pain of cancer or other illness, or struggled with the darkness of depression or addiction? Perhaps you are dealing with a broken relationship or are fearful of the future.

The Letter of James says this about the ministry of healing – *Are any among you suffering? They should pray. Are any cheerful? They should sing songs of praise. Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up, and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven. Therefore, confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, so that you may be healed. James 5:13-16a*

Our Evangelical Lutheran Worship hymnal provides a brief “Service of Healing” that we will begin incorporating into the regular Sunday morning worship service one Sunday per month during the summer months – June 5, July 10, and August 21.

“The order for healing is an expression in worship of the church’s ministry of healing. Here all who sense the need for God’s healing in any aspect of their lives may join in prayer for others and themselves. Here each person may come to receive a word of blessing and prayer. Here each one may also receive a physical gesture of healing: the laying on of hands, which may be accompanied by anointing with oil. These signs, first given in baptism, tell us again that we are sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked forever with the cross of Christ, who is health and salvation for the whole world.



In its ministry of healing, the church does not replace the gifts of God that come through the scientific community nor does it promise a cure. Rather, the church offers and celebrates gifts such as these: God’s presence with strength and comfort in time of suffering, God’s promise of wholeness and peace, and God’s love embodied in the community of faith.” (Reprinted from the Evangelical Lutheran Worship hymnal.)

What a wonderful responsibility and privilege we have to bear one another’s burdens and to pray for healing for ourselves and our Sisters and Brothers in Christ!

Sanctuary Renovation

“I was glad when they said to me, ‘Let us go to the house of the Lord.’” Ps. 122:12

Did you know that the worship space we gather in on Sunday mornings is 142 years old?! Every Sunday, as well as other times, we might well say to ourselves, “I was glad when they said to me, ‘Let us go to the house of the Lord.’” As we gather in the worship space we recognize that we are in the presence of God. This is the space that our children have been baptized in, that we perhaps were confirmed in, or have buried a loved one from. Our worship space means many things to many people. It is a space that we have been given as a place to gather where through water and the word, wine and bread, we are accepted, nourished and sent out to proclaim the gospel for the sake of the world.

Our worship space is a gift from God and we are responsible for taking care of this gift. With this in mind, it has been quite a number of years since we last gave this space a “face-lift”! Time has taken its toll—walls need fresh paint, cracks in the plaster are in need of repair, as is the altar and furnishings in the chancel area. Take a good look around the next time you come to the house of the Lord and see that it is time for some renewal.

After consultation with a building consultant from the ELCA Mission Investment Fund, the council has approved the formation of committees to begin plans for a Sanctuary Renovation. Each team will have specific duties and will report to an ‘oversight’ committee with their recommendations. Once the oversight committee feels confident in the recommendations from the various committees they will forward the overall recommendations to the church council. The church council will review the plan and bring it before a specially called congregation meeting. There is plenty of work to do before we even begin the actual renovation. It is hoped that we will be able to involve as many folks from the congregation as possible in the planning of the renovation.

Pastor's report 1) Pastor to place an article in local paper and send info out to local churches for a new Youth Worker. **2)** Listening sessions to engage our parents of young children. 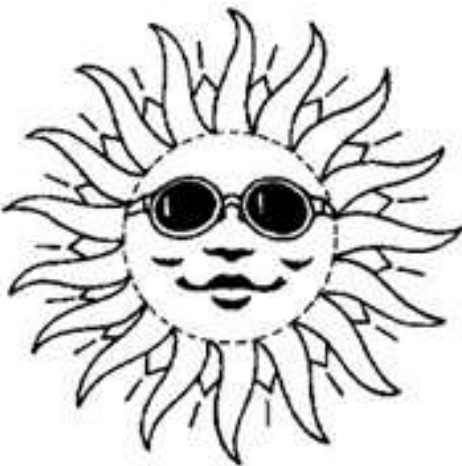
