SHAWANO CONFERENCE ASSEMBLY SERVICE PROJECT

This year the Oshkosh Conference will be the recipients of our Assembly Service Project, Solutions Center Shelters and Support Services. Solutions Center Shelters and Support Services offers the only domestic violence and homeless shelters in Fond du Lac County. They house 24 women and children, 15 men, a warming shelter that provides an evening meal and a light breakfast for 16 adults and a family shelter that has the capacity to house a family of 8. They offer legal advocacy, individual and family therapy, structured support groups, youth and teen advocacy, safety planning, 24/7 crisis intervention, case management, homeless prevention planning, and eviction/disconnection assistance. Their caring and dedicated staff is on hand 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. They rely heavily on donations, material and monetary, to provide life saving programs and services.

We can help those in need by bringing in, garbage bags (sizes 13 gallon kitchen or trash). This organization will benefit greatly from your giving. Thank you so much for helping out with this year's service project.

Treasurer's report Approved as presented M/S/C Carson, Rhodes

Pastor's report: 1) Pastor has been in contact with Mission Investment fund and has set up a meeting for leadership and interested members of the congregation. 2) Cindy Evan's made a generous donation in memory of John to be used for restoration of our current altar, pulpit, baptismal font and furniture. 3) Thank-you to Nancy Rhode and worship committee for wreath outside and decorating church for Easter. 3) Hasn't heard any more information about hosting 4-6 visitors from companion synod in Africa. 5) May 8th will take up a collection of 13-gallon garbage bags as a service project this year. This will be to support Solutions Center Shelter and Support Services. (Shawano Conference)

Ministry Team Reports: a) **Budget & Finance:** did not meet. b) **Building & Property:** Discussed Parsonage Appliances, Bubbler, parking lot-seal coating and repair to manhole cover area.

c) **Christian Formation:** did not meet. d) **CARE:** Mentoring going well. Over 40 people attended fellowship after confirmation. Brochures are ready to be printed. e) **Personnel:** did not meet. Yudes suggested coming up with an evaluation form for personnel. f) **Stewardship:** Pastor Mary reported that Clean-up Day for Church and Grounds will be on May 15th. g) **Worship:** Carson reported that the Taize services for Lent were well liked. Worship Service times going to the summer schedule beginning Sunday May 29th - One service at 9:00am on Sundays and Wednesday Chapel will move from 7:00pm to 6:00pm. Rhode will be the new liaison for Worship committee. Ray Ackerman will be donating a new pascal candle. (possibly oil) Pastor Mary will also check about a new stand.

Leadership Formation: Pastor Mary handed out article "Leaders Love the Front Seat, Not the Back Window". Good Discussion about honoring the past and looking to the Future.

Old Business: a) **Higher interest bearing accounts.** Viestenz checked with Capitol Credit Union on their interest payment. CD's (12 months) .65% Money Markets .4 % Split 50/50 possibility of between \$400-\$500 yearly interest earned. Berry checked NEW Credit Union only .32%.

b) **Parsonage appliances-** Matravers will allow \$125.00 trade in for old appliances and they will dispose of. Amana refrigerator- \$1000.00, Amana 24" Dishwasher- \$390.88, Frigidaire Electric range-\$380.00, 30" range hood-\$135.00. Total installed with trade-in allowance = \$1780.80

Motion by Rhode, 2nd by Yudes to go ahead with purchase and use money from Thrivent Choice Dollars. Motion carried. c) **Water Fountain repair or replace-** Replacement cost \$1500.00.

Building and Property Committee will check to see if the old one can be repaired or a cost on a different model.

This is at no charge to F.A.L.C.
