Mission Statement

Because we are a part of the family of God, saved by grace through our Lord Jesus Christ, we are empowered by God, to provide the means for Christian growth, and to equip the members, with the help of the Holy Spirit, to be the heart, hands, and feet of Jesus Christ in our daily lives.

“Ready or not...

...here I come!” I’m guessing that you also used these words when playing Hide and Seek, after hiding your eyes and counting while everyone else scrambled to find a hiding place. (Do children still play this and yell it out—or is there an electronic version now for Hide and Seek?) Well these are Advent words, too. Not Advent in the ‘frantic preparations for Christmas which is coming whether we are ready or not’ way, but in the ‘God is coming in Christ Jesus whether we are ready or not’ kind of a way.

And how could we ever be ready? We fail so often to live generously and love unconditionally—or even to think about God’s purpose as we go about our daily tasks—that we are never ‘ready’ to receive our Savior. This is the somber side of Advent, a gentle but firm reorienting of our lives and hearts to consider and prepare our hearts for a God who comes to us, whether we are ready or not.

But this is the hope and good news of Advent as well! For it is not only the God of the end times calling us to sober reflection and expectant living but a tiny babe who comes—as babies do—whether we are ready or not, to bless our lives with purpose and joy.

In our baptisms Christ has already found us and claimed us, after all. When we wander off into hiding places of despair or disillusionment or depression or... (insert your hiding place here) we hear his voice, once again, calling to us in love—‘Ready or not, here I come!’ Or maybe, more to the point: ‘All-y All-y In Free!’

Congregational Council Meeting Notes of November 17, 2015

Present: Pastor Mary, Berry, Carson, Connell, Flint, Garrigan, Heiser, Jacquart, Neta, Riley, Werner, Yudes, Treasurer McCarthy. Excused: Tachick.

Agenda set after addition under *Old Business*, item d. *Laptop Purchase*; under *New Business*, item c. *Signage* – John Carson and item d. *council terms*.

Council minutes of October 20, 2015 were accepted as written. M/S/C Carson, Riley.

Treasurer's Report – envelope offerings are still behind and of growing concern, but the rest of the budget is on track. M/S/C Jacquart, Werner to approve report as presented.

Pastor's Report: 1) David Berry continues to work on the office computer and Pastor's laptop. The laptop may need a new hard drive; 2) the laptop that is used for worship services has crashed; 3) A "New Member Class" was held Sunday, November 15. Reception of new members will be Sunday, December 6; 4) FALC will host the Ecumenical Thanksgiving Service on November 25 at 7:00 p.m.;

5) Council members who are up for a second term need to inform the Nominating Committee of their intentions; 6) The "Christmas Letter" is ready; 7) Christmas/New Year worship schedule has been set.

Ministry Team Reports: as listed in the TIE.

Devotion/Book discussion: tabled until next month.

Old Business: a) Altar Renovation – Cary reported that the pizza sale made a profit of \$1,324.00. She has met with Bill Galick who looked over the condition of the walls, Steve Anderson for flooring ideas and has Alyssa Boucher working on color schemes; b) Benevolence evaluation – will be discussed under New Business with the proposed budget; c) Projection cords – not completed as yet; d) Laptop purchase – M/S/C Carson, Yudes to have Berry purchase a laptop, a new hard drive for Pastor's laptop, anti-virus software and Microsoft office for an approximate total of \$850.00 to be taken from the maintenance budget.

New Business: a) A draft of the proposed 2016 FALC budget was presented followed by a lengthy question/discussion which also included discussion on Benevolence. It was suggested to lower the Benevolence to 3% with continued discussion at the next Budget & Finance Meeting of December 10 and the December 15 council meeting; b) the annual meeting will be January 31. On that Sunday there will be one service at 10:00 a.m. followed by the annual meeting after which there will be a potluck;

c) Signage – John Carson has been instrumental in arranging for a 12' x 48' billboard donation from Jones Signs. The billboard is located by the Brookside Shell Station and will have a Christmas theme and include our church name. WOW! M/S/C Heiser, Riley to accept this fantastic donation. As you are traveling south toward Green Bay in the next week or so, watch for this sign!; d) Council terms – Cathie Connell, Scott Garrigan and Beth Tachick are up for renewal in January. All three declined to serve a second term due to work schedules and/or other responsibilities.

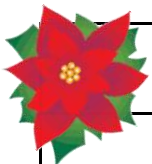

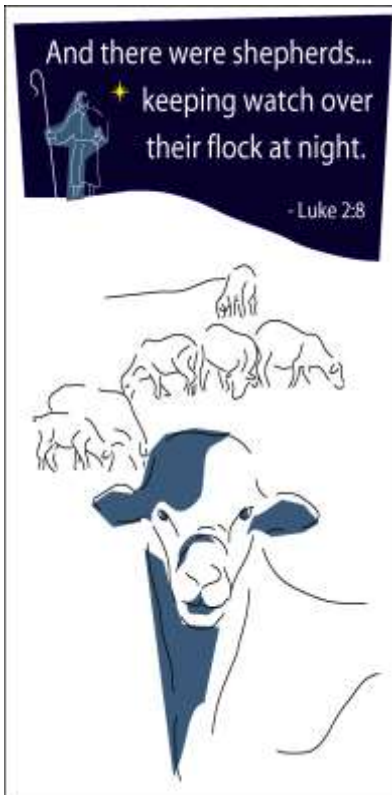
