Mission Statement

Because we are a part of the family of God, saved by grace through our Lord Jesus Christ, we are empowered by God, to provide the means for Christian growth, and to equip the members, with the help of the Holy Spirit, to be the heart, hands, and feet of Jesus Christ in our daily lives.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

“Return to the Lord, your God, who is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love.”

In a matter of a couple of weeks we will enter into the season of Lent—a period of 40 days when we are invited to consider those places in our lives, those attitudes, behaviors, etc., that have caused us to turn away from God. Having identified our distance and separation from God, we are invited to return to the Lord, trusting in God’s great love for us. This sort of soul searching requires time set apart to reflect on where we are in our life journey. Times of meditation and silence allow us to see more clearly our need for God.

In our busy lives it’s often difficult to find time for the sort of reflection that the Lenten season calls us into. We have jobs to do, children to care for, doctor’s appointments to make, volunteer activities to do...and the list goes on and on! Who has time for self-reflection?!

This year our Mid-week Lenten services will provide you with a time to reflect on your life and your faith journey. We will gather on Wednesday evenings at 7p.m. to sing, reflect, read scripture, and hear from characters from the bible who participated in Jesus’ last days.

The form of worship we will use comes to us from the Taizé Community, an ecumenical monastic order in Taizé, Burgundy, France. The community was founded in 1940 by Brother Roger Shutz, a Reformed Protestant, and is composed of more than one hundred brothers, from Catholic and Protestant traditions, who originate from about thirty countries across the world. The community has become one of the world’s most important sites of Christian pilgrimage.

The worship and music of Taize emphasizes simple phrases, usually from Psalms, other pieces of scripture, or from the liturgy. The phrases are repeated in a quiet, rhythmic manner. Periods of quiet allows for reflection. Candles and icons add to the worship experience. This model of worship and music is held in churches throughout the world.

What about our children? Will they be able to participate in a TAIZE worship service? That depends on your child. For those children who find that this sort of worship does not work for them, we will have an area set-up with a group art project that the children can work on each week while mom and dad are in worship!

Return to the Lord with your whole heart!

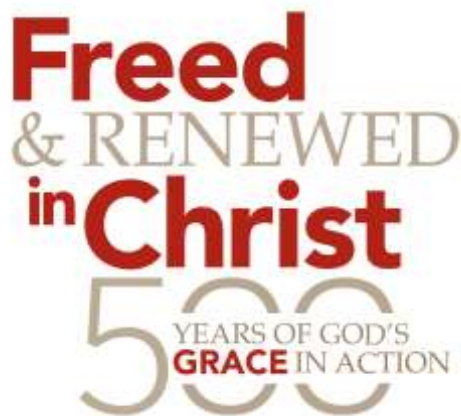

500 Years of Evangelical Reformation 1517-2017

When Martin Luther posted his “Ninety-five Theses” on the church door in Wittenberg in 1517, no one expected the breadth of evangelical reforms in Christian teaching and practice that followed. In every dimension of Christian faith a renewed trust in God’s forgiving mercy replaced a reliance on teachings and practices that, like the sale of indulgences, were vulnerable to abuse and corruption. Preaching a few years later, Luther said, “I opposed indulgences ... but never with force. I simply taught, preached, and wrote God’s Word; otherwise I did nothing. I did nothing; the Word did everything.” When he began to propose reforms in worship, he wrote similar words. “This is the sum of the matter: let everything be done

so that the Word may have free course.”

Nearly 500 years later, the results of this evangelical confidence in God’s forgiving and liberating Word are evident today in Christian communities of all types. In the years leading to 2017 ELCA members, congregations and synods will observe the anniversary of this evangelical reformation in a variety of ways with numerous partners.

Treasurer's report indicated that the 2015 budget year finished in the black, with the books to be closed at the end of January. M/S/C Jacquart, Riley to accept report as presented.

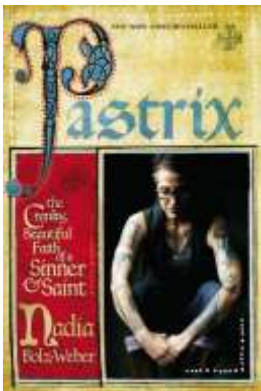
